





All teachers are either native or fluent English speakers.








CSW Facilities:




Last year's Grade 8 exam results:

Significantly higher scores in Math and English than other elementaries in Mokotów, Warsaw, and the rest of Poland.

These results are almost identical to those in 2020.

The Grade 8 exams are obligatory for all students in Poland, regardless of nationality.

These results directly affect applications for Polish high schools.

Outstanding Student achievements:

Our students represented 15% of the overall number of OJAJ English competition winners in Poland: six Laureates and two finalists.

These students won free access to any - even the most prestigious - public high schools in the country.

Two of our students were also finalists in the Kuratoryjny English competition, organized by the Mazovia School Superintendent.

The Canadian School of Warsaw became an authorized International Baccalaureate (IB) World School on January 6, 2014

The IB offers quality programmes of international education that share a powerful vision.

IB Education:

- Focuses on learners: The IB's student-centred programmes promote healthy relationships, ethical responsibility and personal challenge
- Develops effective approaches to teaching and learning: IB programmes help students to develop the attitudes and skills they need for both academic and personal success
- Works within global contexts: IB programmes increase understanding of languages and cultures, and explore globally significant ideas and issues
- Explores significant content: IB programmes offer a curriculum that is broad and balanced, conceptual and connected



- CSW offers the Primary Years Programme (PYP) which is rich, inquiry-based, transdisciplinary curriculum framework that builds conceptual understanding.
- The PYP is designed for students aged 3 to 12. It focuses on the development of the whole child as an inquirer, both in the classroom and in the world outside.
- The PYP is flexible to accommodate the demands of most national or local curriculums, which in our case is Polish National Curriculum.
- The PYP aims to generate in its students an enthusiasm for learning, encouraging them to value learning as a lifelong process.
- The PYP addresses students' academic, social and emotional well-being.
- The PYP encourages students to develop independence and to take responsibility for their own learning.
- The PYP supports students' efforts to gain understanding of the world and to function comfortably within it.
- The PYP helps students establish personal values as a foundation upon which international-mindedness will develop and flourish.





The Primary Years Programme is guided by six transdisciplinary themes of global significance, explored using knowledge and skills derived from six subjects areas, as well as transdisciplinary skills, with a powerful emphasis on inquiry.

The six subject areas identified within the IB's Primary Years Programme:

- Science
- Social Studies
- Arts
- Personal, Social and Physical Education

IB Primary Years Programme - Transdisciplinary themes:

Who we are

Inquiry into the nature of the self; beliefs and values; person, physical, mental, social and spiritual health; human relationships including families, friends, communities, and cultures; rights and responsibilities; what it means to be human.

Where we are in place and time

Inquiry into orientation in place and time; personal histories; homes and journeys; the discoveries, explorations and migrations of humankind; the relationship between and the interconnectedness of individuals and civilizations, from local and global perspectives.

How we express ourselves

Inquiry into the ways in which we discover and express ideas, feelings, nature, culture, beliefs and values; the ways in which we reflect on, extend and enjoy our creativity; our appreciation of the aesthetic.

How the world works

Inquiry into the natural world and its laws, the interaction between the natural world (physical and biological) and human societies; how humans use their understanding of scientific principles; the impact of scientific and technological advances on society and on the environment.

How we organize ourselves

Inquiry into the interconnectedness of human-made systems and communities; the structure and function of organizations; societal decision-making; economic activities and their impact on humankind and the environment.

Sharing the planet

Inquiry into rights and responsibilities in the struggle to share finite resources with other people and other living things; communities and the relationship within and between them; access to equal opportunities; peace and conflict resolution.





The IB has organized the Primary Years Programme into three essential pillars:

THE LEARNER

The learner is at the heart of the programme which helps to maintain a rigorous, relevant curriculum that uses reflection and informed action in a constant cycle of planning, teaching, and assessment.

The students at the Canadian School of Warsaw strive to become inquirers, knowledgeable, thinkers, communicators, principled, open-minded, caring, risk-takers, balanced, and reflective.

These attributes represent a broad range of human capacities and responsibilities that go beyond intellectual development and academic success.






The IB has organized the Primary Years Programme into three essential pillars:

LEARNING AND TEACHING

IB outlines research-based best practices that teachers use in the planning and implementation of curriculum.

Some of these strategies that best support learning may include using hands-on experiences, employing a variety of media to explore content, working collaboratively, discussing and presenting ideas.





The IB has organized the Primary Years Programme into three essential pillars:

THE LEARNING COMMUNITY

All the members of a school community including the students, teachers, families, and school leaders have important roles in the education of students. Each stakeholder in the learning community has responsibility and agency to influence learning in various capacities.

The IB World community and ultimately the global community are also seen as valuable contexts for learning. Above all, IB emphasizes that learning is social and collaborative, grounded in strong relationships.





PYP Exhibition

Students at the Canadian School of Warsaw have the opportunity to demonstrate a deeper sense of learning by applying their knowledge to service and action.

The PYP Exhibition in Grade 6 is the culminating process of our students' experiences as an IB learner.

This process celebrates their growth as international students and global citizens.

It provides the students with an opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge, attitudes, learner profile, and abilities to take action while being involved in an investigation of their own.
